The Lewis and Clark Trail Heritage Foundation (LCTHF), Inc. was created to stimulate public appreciation of the Lewis and Clark Expedition's contributions to America's Heritage and to support education, research, development and preservation of the Lewis and Clark story. The foundation also serves as advocate, interpreter and protector of the trail.

For more than 40 years, the Foundation and its chapters have promoted Lewis and Clark scholarship, developed educational programs and encouraged the telling of all the stories of the Expedition. Foundation programs encourage cultural awareness, protection of sacred sites and stewardship of the natural, cultural and historical resources along the Trail.

The Foundation works with Native American tribes, tourism bureaus and federal agencies including the National Park Service, the Bureau of Land Management and the U.S.D.A/Forest Service to preserve and protect the trail.

The Foundation is a non-profit, 501(c)(3), corporation. Memberships include subscriptions to *We Proceeded On*, the Foundation's scholarly publication, which is issued quarterly. Memberships of more than \$49 are tax deductible.
